

### **General School Logistics:**

The first day of school is always a busy and exciting time. We are excited to welcome our students back to school and engage with our families. We want to keep everyone safe and engaged in learning. In addition to this, be sure that your child's teacher knows how your learner is to get home from school. Please note that early dismissals and last-minute dismissal changes cannot be accommodated after 3:30 pm.

#### **Arrival:**

We welcome students to come to school as early as 8:50 am. Students arriving by school bus will enter the building through Door #1. They will have the option to stop by the cafeteria to grab breakfast and, weather permitting, they will head to the schoolyard for morning recess. Morning recess will last from 8:50 am until 9:23 am. Prior to 8:50 am, there is no adult supervision, so please be mindful and do not leave your child unattended.

If you are driving your student(s) to school, please access the back lot, **STAY IN YOUR CAR**, and form the morning drop-off line. Once your vehicle reaches the barricades, students should GET OUT OF THE VEHICLE **ON THE PASSENGER SIDE** and enter the schoolyard. It is pivotal that you stay in the car to keep the line moving. If you need to get out of your vehicle, please park, but be mindful that staff members are arriving to school and will need to park in the same parking spots that you are

<u>accessing to be there for students.</u> There are **no left turns from the school parking lot**. Please plan to turn right.

Should you choose to stay to watch morning recess, we ask that you stand near the barricades and not interact with other students to ensure the safety of all students. We ask that you always show Dragon PRIDE while on the school grounds.

### Breakfast, Lunch, and Recess:

- Breakfast will take place in the cafeteria from 8:50 am until 9:25 am.
- All students will eat lunch in the cafeteria.
- Recess: All students will have recess with classroom teachers and/or assigned staff members.

### **School Hours/Entering the Building:**

School begins at 9:25 am and concludes at 4:22 pm. Mallinckrodt Academy will open to students at 8:50 am.

- Other than morning arrival, please always use Door #1 (the main entrance on Pernod) for access to the school building.
- Students who are late to school will enter through door #1 and have the option to have a light breakfast before proceeding to the office to get a pass to go to class.

#### **Dismissal**

- To reiterate, please be sure that your child and their teacher are aware of how they are getting home. It may be helpful to place this information on an index card in their backpack, along with your contact information and an emergency contact. You may also want to share this with teachers at the Party on the Playground.
- We open doors for dismissal at 4:15pm.
- All students who identify as parent pick-up will be dismissed from Door #5 unless you elect to utilize the carpool line. If you come to sign your child out, you will need to park and walk to Door #5. During afternoon dismissal, our school playground will be closed from 4 pm -4:30 pm, or as soon as the carpool line is over. You are welcome and encouraged to come to the playground once we have finished dismissal. Please do not allow your children to be in front of the school building and play while we are dismissing for school buses. Our goal is to keep everyone safe.

### **Before and After Care Information:**

Here is an update about before/aftercare at our school. Our before and after care provider will continue to be the YMCA, as it has been in the past. The district elected to keep before and after care programs this year as close to the same as they were last year to help provide continuity in services provided. This program offers start times as early as 6:30 am and end times as late as 6 pm.
