





We'll be back next year for our 2025 spelling bee! Thank you for all of your support with this year's spelling bee.



Throughout the day on the March 14, 2024, the final day of classes before Spring Break, Principal Young and his administrative team held three separate meetings in the Carr Lane Theater. There was a meeting for each of the three grade levels. Principal Young expressed his concern for the well-being of his students during the days away from school.
