Research

Any activity aiming at increasing our body of knowledge. It encompasses all investigation, measurement, and evaluation activities - including study design, pilots, data collection and analysis, interpretation of results, and conclusions and recommendations.

Who should submit a research proposal?

- Any individual or organization conducting research in or on SLPS students, staff, schools, and programs.
- SLPS employees conducting research for graduate work

IRB & SLPS Review

Why is the review process important to the district?

University / Organizational Institutional Review Board (IRB)	SLPS Research Review Committee
Protecting human subjects -against coercion -physical, emotional, or mental harm -confidentiality	Protecting students, faculty, staff -time -confidentiality -data
Identify and minimize possible risks and ensure benefits to participation are not gained through coercion	Quality of research and applicability to district priorities or needs



Review / Approval Process

- Write research proposal
 - Secure site (e.g., school) & university (e.g., IRB, advisor) approval, as applicable
 - SLPS Employees will also participate in a pre-submission interview with research committee
- Submit proposal to SLPS Research
 - SLPS Research committee conducts initial review (every other month see review dates table)
 - Questions, edits, clarifications may be requested
- Feedback/edits
 - Update proposal, incorporating district feedback (build in additional time for this)
 - Resubmit to SLPS Research
- Receive final decision
 - Generally, 4-6 weeks after submission. May be longer at certain times of the academic year (e.g., around quarter ends)
- Collect data, analyze results
 - Check-in after data collection
- Share Executive Summary Research Office & other internal SLPS stakeholders
 - Within 3 months of research end (e.g. you defend your dissertation)

Research Proposal

Persuasive Document

- Why is this research important?
- How will your proposed method answer your research question(s)?
- What approval(s) do you have to do the research?
- Why does SLPS need this study?



Factors Considered in Review/Approval

- Benefits of research to SLPS students, staff, and programs
 - SLPS need or interest in research topic
 - Consult Research Priorities, p. 19
 - Disruption to schools, students, staff
 - Overlap with existing research or partnerships
 - To reduce burden on students & staff, proposals may not be approved if similar research or projects are already underway in the district
- Methodological soundness
 - E.g., do methods and literature review align with research question(s)?



COVID-19 & Virtual Learning

- The district does not allow recording of any video or teleconferencing of students' observation and interaction during virtual instruction
- Another adult must be present for any research involving observation or virtual interaction with students
- Teams is the SLPS-preferred platform for virtual instruction (synchronous & asynchronous), student-teacher meetings, and student presentations
 - Class Dojo and Zoom are also approved

Final Suggestions

- Can your research question be answered using publicly available data?
 - Check <u>DESE</u>, <u>NCES</u>, and <u>ICPSR</u>
- Watch use of causal language in non-causal studies
 - "what the effect of [intervention]", referencing effect sizes
- Edit & proofread



Ask a non-expert to read your proposal for clarity & questions!
