




ESOL Choice Board for Grades 6-8

<p>Monday</p> <p>We can tell things about characters by looking at the following characteristics (STEAL):</p> <p>Characterization S.T.E.A.L</p> <p>Speech: What does the character say? How do they say it? What is their tone? Their word choice?</p> <p>Thoughts: What does the character think? What do we learn from their thoughts & ideas?</p> <p>Effects: What is this character's effect on others? How do they interact with other characters?</p> <p>Actions: What does this character do? How do they behave? What can we learn from their actions?</p> <p>Looks: What does this character look like?
