Simile= a comparison using like or as

<u>Metaphor=</u> a comparison between two things that aren't alike but have something in common

<u>Hyperbole=</u>exaggerated statements or claims not meant to be taken literally

<u>Personification=</u> giving human characteristics to something that isn't human (an animal, object, etc.)
