

In the decisive third set, Lift for Life took control early and never looked back, dominating Gateway STEM with a final score of 15-3 to seal the match.





Though Johnson is eager to introduce himself to teachers and students. In a message shared with staff, Mr. Johnson expressed his enthusiasm for meeting the school community.


