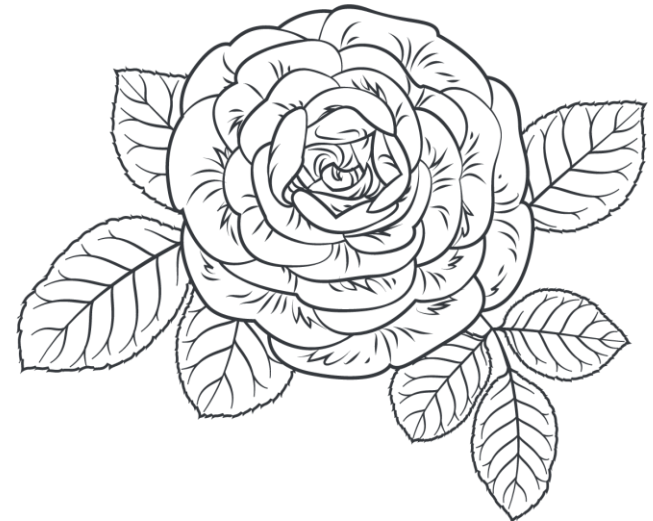
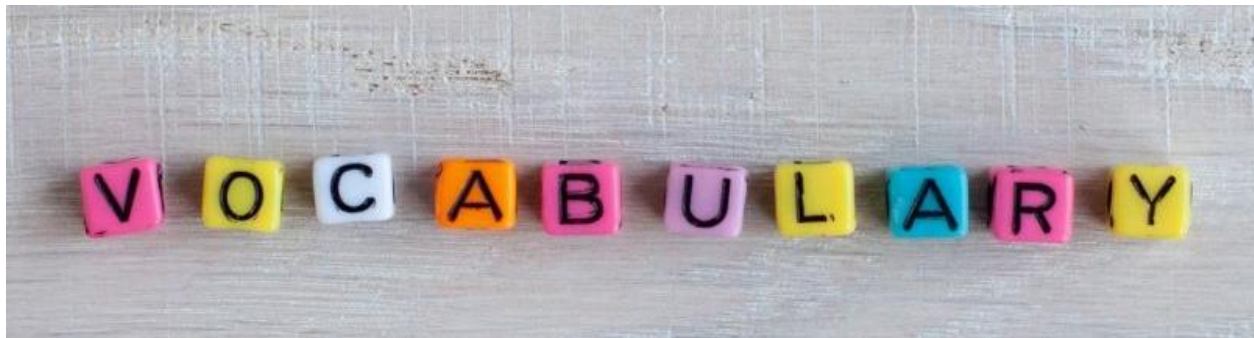

How to Study, Part 1

Yes, you *can* study for the English II EOC!

Study Type 1: Vocabulary & Conventions

- **Memorize roots and affixes:** Build vocabulary by understanding word origins.
- **Grammar & Punctuation:** Brush up on sentence structure, usage, and common conventions.



How to Study, Part 2

Study Type 2: Literary Analysis & Reading Skills

- **Literary Devices & Text Structure:** Review similes, metaphors, symbolism, and how texts are organized (compare/contrast, cause/effect, etc.).
- **Theme, Tone, & Character Analysis:** Practice identifying a work's central ideas, mood, and character development.



How to Study, Part 3

Study Type 3: Writing & Test Strategies

- **Essay Writing & Textual Evidence:** Work on crafting clear, organized essays that support ideas with evidence from the text.
- **Active Reading & Practice Tests:** Use annotation to engage with texts and take practice exams to familiarize yourself with the question types.



And last but not least ...

General Test-Taking Strategies

Pace Yourself: Divide your time so you can carefully read passages and have time to review your answers.

Active Reading: Annotating helps you focus on important details and makes it easier to find evidence later.

Answer Strategically: Tackle the questions you feel confident about first. Flag tougher questions to revisit later.

Review Carefully: If time allows, double-check your answers. Make sure you didn't misread a question or skip a detail in your analysis.
