Classroom teachers send home monthly newsletters outlining current curricular focus. Monthly newsletters also provide parents with updates on district and state assessments: STAR, CFA, CSA and MAP. Alongside learning topics and dates for testing, newsletters often feature tips for productive test-taking (emphasis on importance of attendance, plenty of rest, "brain food," etc.). Each semester parents and caretakers are invited to Parent-Teacher Conferences where individual student progress towards assessment goals are shared. Shaw VPA coordinates with parents unable to attend district-scheduled conferences in order to set up meetings on other dates or over the phone. Outside of district-scheduled Parent-Teacher
