Vision for Summer Learning

Saint Louis Public Schools will provide a high-quality summer learning experience that includes core academic content, enrichment, field trips, supplemental services, and social emotional learning to support deeper learning for scholars across grades Pre-K-12.



- **Goal #1:**
At the end of Camp SLPS, each scholar in grades KG-8th will grow 2 months according to the STAR Reading & Math assessment compared to the end of year 2022/2023 screening window.
- **Goal #2:**
At the end of Camp SLPS, each scholar participating in high school courses (credit recovery or enrichment) will earn a minimum of 1 credit.

Scholars Identified for Participation



- High school scholars who require credit recovery
- Any scholar reading 1 year or more below their grade level (K-8)
- SB319 identified scholars reading 2 or more years below grade level
- Scholars receiving ESOL services
- P4 scholars transitioning to Kindergarten
- Scholars who are eligible for Extended School Year (ESY)
- High school scholars who are interested in an enrichment pathway centered on elective courses

Summer Learning 2022 Recap



•Enrollment

- 4,036 (K-12)
- 22% of scholars from 2021-2022 school year

•Data/Outcomes

- K-8 Reading Growth: 4% minimum per grade level
 - Grade 2: 9%
 - Grade 3: 9%
 - Grade 4: 14%
- HS Credits Recovered: 908.5
- Additional Graduates: 8



Proposed Changes for 2023

- Simplifying registration process to be family-driven with school-based support
- Site-specific programming for early childhood centers (Stix & Wilkinson)
- Targeted transition program for rising 7th grade scholars from neighborhood elementary schools
- Providing enrichment pathways for high school scholars
- Empowering site leaders with additional responsibilities and professional development

- Summer learning site leaders identified by **Wednesday, March 1st**
- Summer learning registration opens by **Friday, March 3rd**
- Staff receive their assignment for employment on a rolling basis beginning **Monday, March 6th**
- Sites will be fully staffed by **Friday, March 31st**
- Scholars and families will receive transportation letters by **Friday, May 12th**

- Design family-driven registration process & begin scholar recruitment
- Submit MOUs for summer partnerships for BOE approval
- Plan professional development for summer staff (leaders and teachers)
- Identify core curriculum resources and social emotional learning resources for K-8 programming
- Design pathways for high school enrichment courses
- Summer Learning Leadership Advisory Team is meeting on an ongoing basis

- Staffing, Supplies, Field Trips, Incentives, Transportation, General Operations, Instructional Resources, and Partnerships to provide additional programming and enrichment
