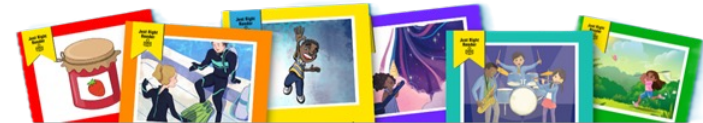


All About Take-Home Decodable Packs

Summer Credit Success Plan

High School Credit Recovery

- **Credit Recovery through Virtual Learning**
- **Learning Platform:** All credit recovery courses will be conducted via the "Schools Personalized Learning Platform" (Schools PLP), leveraging the [auto-graded course catalogue](#) specifically designed for credit recovery.
- **Eligibility Criteria:** Enrollment in credit recovery courses is reserved for high school students who need to retake a class they've completed but did not pass, in order to meet graduation requirements.
- **Course Assignment:** Initially, students will be enrolled in two credit recovery courses. Upon successful completion opportunities for additional courses may be provided.
