TRANSPORTATION

- 31 Special Education Routes
- 130 Regular Routes
- One Student Per Seat
- 1/2 Mile Distance Eligibility
- Closest Corner Bus Stop



FOOD SITES

- 18 food distribution sites – 3,000 meals a week
- Parent/guardian can pick up food from any food distribution site. Remained the same.
- Pick-up on Mondays (one-day pickup). Remained the same.
- Parents receive a 5-day meal kit, which includes breakfast and lunch. Moved to 7-day meal kit.

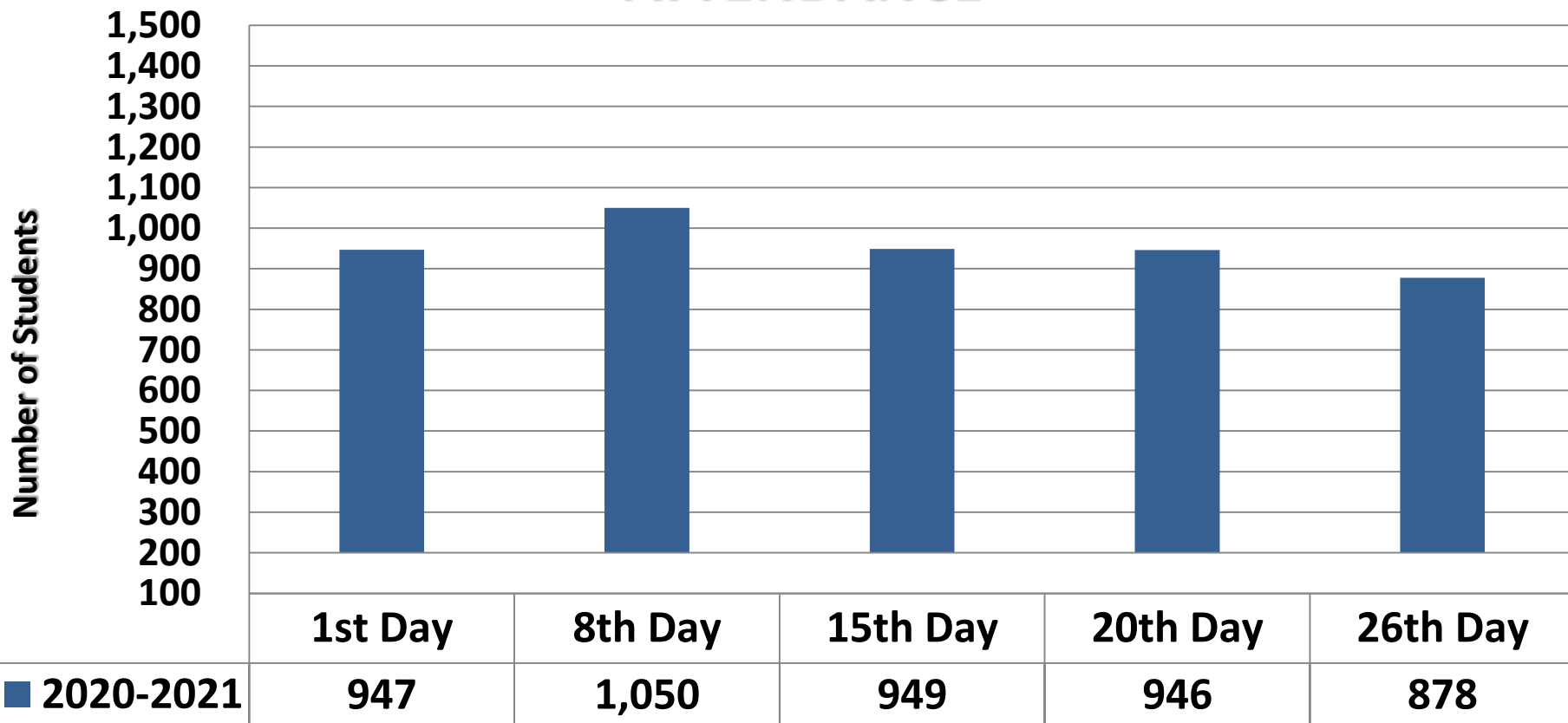

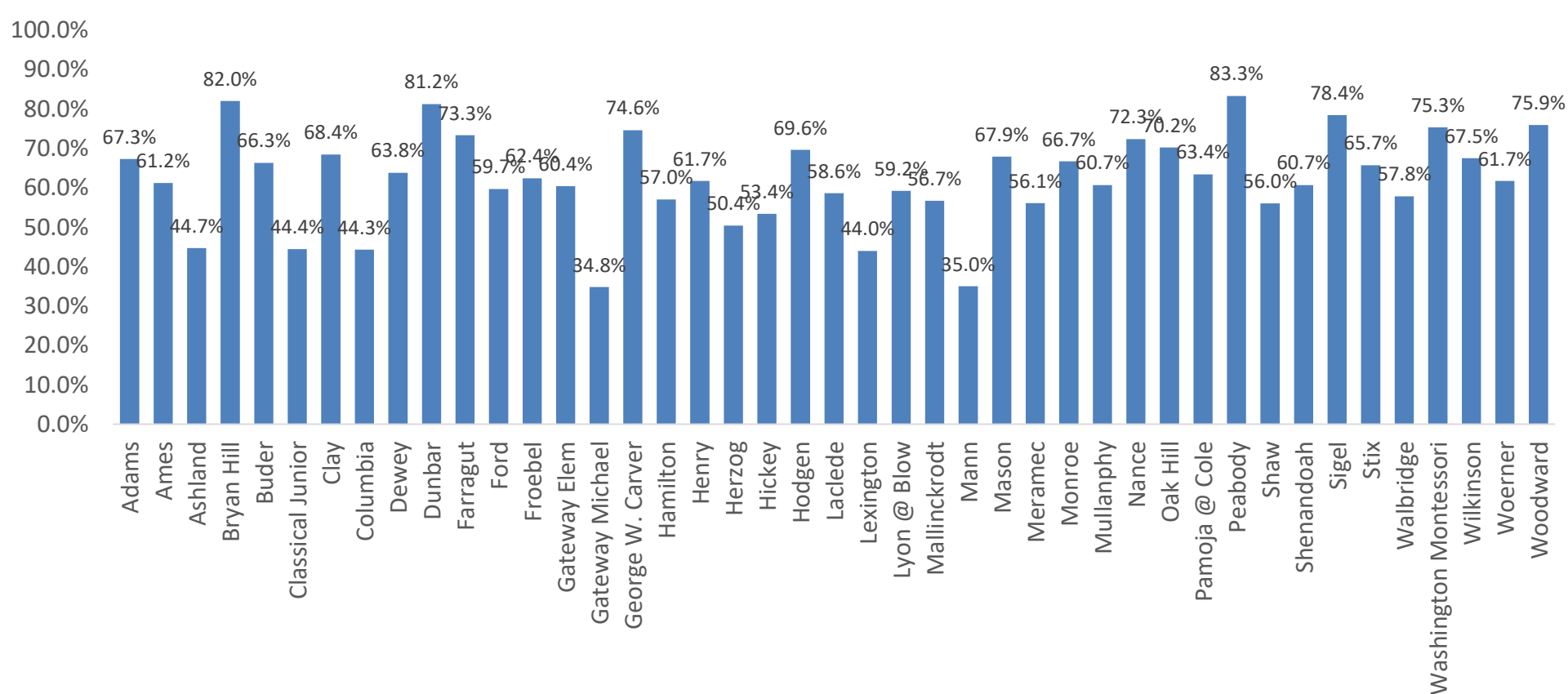

RESTART UPDATE

Adhere to Saint Louis City DOH guidance, SLPS recommendations to help schools to plan for a safe reopening

- All staff and students must wear masks
- Maintain 6 feet distance, and students remain in a cohort as much as possible
- Limit classroom enrollment (approximately 10 students)
- Equip classrooms and common areas with hand sanitizing and disinfectant supplies
- Hand sanitizer stations in schools, as needed
- Daily temperature checks
- Routinely disinfect high-touch point areas (i.e. doorknobs, rails, light switches)
- Use electrostatic sprayers, foggers and sponge applicators for fast disinfecting
- Facilities team will coordinate, schedule and deep clean any classroom, office or common area suspected of contamination





RESTART UPDATE

MERAMEC IN PERSON/ONLINE PRE-K–2ND GRADE

7 Classrooms:

- 2 PreK rooms - only in person
- 2 KG rooms, online and in person
- 1 First grade room, online and in person
- 1 First/Second split, online and in person
- 1 Second grade room, online and in person

Total students who requested to return in person: **61 out of 119**

Average in person student attendance during last two weeks: **48**

Average students still learning online in Grades PreK-2: **71**

Staffing:

- 7 classroom teachers
- 1 PE
- 1 Music
- 1 SPED
- Other support staff:
 - 1 PreK Aide
 - 2 ICA
 - FCS
 - ISS Monitor
 - Counselor
 - .5 Library aide

Related Arts:

PE and Music come to a grade level at the same time and push into the rooms. For First/Second grade where there are three rooms, they have the ISS monitor or other support staff stay in one room while they TEAMS call the room next door to participate in the lesson.

Key Lessons:

- Using the teacher laptop connected to the smart board **and** teacher iPad in the TEAMS call allows for the most flexibility for video, audio and microphone access.
- Alignment of the in person and virtual learning schedules is challenging but important.
- Flexibility for all staff to support at home learners is critical
- Establishing routines and expectations for independent work is even more critical than ever before otherwise things become even more overwhelming for teachers.

- School Dismissal One Hour Early Daily
- Students
- A/B Schedule – Gateway, Dewey, Stix and Wilkinson
- Breakfast in the Classroom
- Lunch in the Classroom or Cafeteria
- Limited Recess Breaks

TESTING - BINAXNOW ANTIGEN TESTING PROGRAM FOR K-12

- Public and private K-12 districts/schools to receive Abbott's BinaxNOW rapid antigen test kits to test symptomatic school personnel and students for COVID
- The Abbott BinaxNOW test is a minimally invasive anterior nasal swab test
- The test must be administered by a trained health professional (e.g. nurse or doctor), and yields results in just 15 minutes without any additional equipment.
