- Enrollment dropped but remained in line with overall % of students attending Summer Learning year over year

CURRICULUM AND READING GROWTH

Overall, students in 3rd and 4th grade grew 1.5 months this summer.

SUMMER PARTNERSHIPS AND EXTENDED LEARNING

- ❑ COCA and Springboard provided Arts instruction to all elementary and middle school students
- ❑ 1000 elementary students had the opportunity to attend Beaumont Scout Reservation for outdoor experiential learning
- ❑ Girl Scouts worked with multiple sites to provide embedded programming
- ❑ Missouri Food Bank piloted a program with Farragut to provide weekend meals to all families served by that summer site
- ❑ Cyber Academy taught coding and technical job skills to HS students at Clyde C. Miller
- ❑ Pre-AP Preparation Program offered to HS students to prepare for the ACT and/or AP Coursework in the fall

CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES



CHALLENGES:

- ❑ Registration process
 - ❑ School-based registration coincides with state testing and end of school activities
- ❑ Snow days:
 - ❑ Possibility of make up days that could postpone the start of Summer Learning.
- ❑ August 2020 start date
 - ❑ The delayed start of school might shift the traditional start and end dates of Summer Learning.

OPPORTUNITIES:

- ❑ Deepen options for high school students to earn credits through virtual programming
- ❑ Provide a targeted literacy boot camp to 3rd and 4th grades during June and July
- ❑ Increase experiential opportunities to include 1 field trip experience for all students
- ❑ Increase Boy Scouts experience to include ALL 3rd-5th Grade Students
- ❑ Expand Missouri Food Bank weekend meals program to all school sites
- ❑ Expand middle school to include enrichment option
