Approved Strategies



- 1 Align bell times: Balance tiers for efficiency and ensure 65 minutes between tiers
- 2 Public transit shift: Use public transit for high schoolers if route meets specific criteria
- Opt-out campaign: District initiative for eligible students not planning to ride the bus
- 4 Stop consolidation: Reduce the number of stops to decrease run time
- 5 Strategic routing: Ensure high-capacity vehicles are assigned the most students





Bell Time Changes



- **Communication with families:** Notifications sent to all families regarding changes; targeted communication to Roosevelt, Sumner, and Vashon regarding the 50-minute bell time change
- **Feedback Collection:** Let's Talk set up to receive feedback and questions on the approved changes; 14 comments received to date
 - **Positive Feedback:** Some families are pleased with the bell time changes
 - Concerns:
 - Safety concerns around the later start for elementary schools, especially with darkness in winter
 - Teachers and staff worried about managing personal appointments and family responsibilities with new bell times
 - Healthy Start Times not being implemented this year





Opt-Out Campaign



Communication to families

- Created and distributed a shorter opt-out survey to all families
- Received 370 opt-out responses so far and aiming to increase responses to achieve necessary ridership reduction
- Additional outreach planned via social media and in-person events to encourage families to opt-out if they
 do not need transportation





Stop Consolidation & Public Transit

Stop Consolidation & Routing

- Routing completed and currently reviewing additional efficiencies to reduce vehicle needs
- Final routes and stops to be communicated to families beginning of August

Public Transit

- ~1700 students meet the no transfer, walk distance, and commute time criteria
- Communication will be sent to these students by the end of this week which will include other resources on how to ride the metro
- Ongoing safety meetings between SLPS and Metro





Safety Planning Updates



A cross departmental team has been meeting to develop and implement a Transportation Safety Plan across the district.

Stop and Route Safety

- Have identified areas of concern and are developing plans to patrol these routes
- Mobile SLPS officers will scope areas around certain bus paths in the morning and afternoon
- Created custom vests for volunteers and staff who will be on the streets supporting these efforts

Metro Safety

- SLPS will provide security at stops located at schools with the most students riding public transit
- Metro Public Safety will monitor trips and routes involving students
- SLPS is developing a safety program which would provide additional monitoring on buses





Additional Updates



- Finalizing agreements with all vendors and actively preparing for a strong start of school
- Identified ~1,500 students were identified:
 - Magnet schools
 - ELL or SPED services,
 - Outside neighborhood boundaries
 - · Received transportation last year

These families will be notified that they will no longer receive transportation since they do not meet the policy requirements.

- Ensuring all vehicles transporting students are equipped with GPS and effective communication tools to track vehicle location and student journeys
- Implementing SLPS signage on all non-bus vehicles for enhanced student safety
- Working with before and after-care team on transportation for these programs





Communication Plan



June

- Present recommendations at June 25th Board Work Session
- Communication goes out to schools and families immediately following meeting
- Talking points provided to school leaders
- "Let's Talk" set up for schools, families, and the community to provide feedback and ask questions

July

- Final proposal presented for approval at July 2 Board Meeting
- Plan details provided to schools and families; Targeted communication provided to families most impacted by changes
- Video presentation on changes to SLPS website & social media
- Continued communication of updates on the website and social media channels
- Update at July 23 Board Work Session

August

- Transportation Community Meeting on August 6
- Creation of "How to use the Metro" video for students
- Routes communicated to families
- Continued communication of updates on the website and social media channels

September & Beyond

- Conduct follow-up metrics checks on effectiveness of plan
- Continued communication of updates on the website and social media channels
- Gather feedback from schools and families and act on insights as possible







Next Steps



- Communicate updates to students who will not be receiving transportation or will be receiving Metro cards
- Finalize safety plans across use of Metro and SLPS stops and communicate updates to schools and families
- Finalize transportation plans for before and aftercare programs
- Transportation Solution meeting on August 6th
- Continuous communication to schools and families leading up to the start of school
