Traits

What are Character Traits?

Character traits are all the aspects of a person's behavior and attitudes that make up that person's **personality**. Everyone has **character traits**, both good and bad. Even **characters** in books have **character traits**. **Character traits** are often shown with descriptive adjectives, like <u>patient</u>, <u>unfaithful</u>, <u>or jealous</u>.

How can we find Character Traits?

Sometimes an author will tell you directly someone's traits, while at other times, the author expects you to infer a character's traits. It will be your job to determine what type of traits that each character in the story show. The author will help you by having the character act in a certain way or to say certain things.

A character's traits sometimes stay the same throughout a story, or based on the events that a character experiences, may change over time. <u>Check out some examples here.</u>


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CHARACTER TRAITS Analysis


