# **SCHOOL POLICY REMINDERS:**



#### **Cell Phone Policy**

To limit all non-instructional cell phone distractions and improve student achievement, we have a zero-tolerance cell phone, headphones, and ear buds policy during instructional time. Students should be turning in their cell phones to their homeroom teachers.

#### Consequence Ladder:

**Step 1:** Verbal Warning from the teacher. The teacher will keep the cell phone and call home to notify the parent/guardian. Students may pick up their cell phone from the teacher at the end of the school day.

**Step 2:** Private teacher conference with student (brief) to redirect behavior. The teacher will call home to notify the parent/guardian. Students may pick up their cell phone in the front office at the end of the school day.

**Step3:** Administration will call to inform the parent/guardian. The parent/guardian (not the student) will need to pick up the cell phone from the front office at the end of the school day.

**Step 4:** Meeting with Grade Level Team Leader, Administrator, and Parent to address behavioral concerns. Every morning, students will turn their cell phone into an office staff member for the remainder of the quarter or semester. Students may pick up their cell phone in the front office at the end of each school day.

Step 5: Administrator Assigned Consequence (In-School/Out-of-School Suspension)
Infractions will start over at the beginning of each semester

Uniform Policy: With cold weather on its way, make sure your student is prepared with the right uniform layers.

#### Shirts, Sweaters, and Sweatshirts:

Shirts with sleeves (long or short), collared shirt, polo shirt, crewneck, or Gateway T-shirt
Solid color sweatshirts without a hood can be worn

Solid shirt colors:

6th grade: : White or Black 7th grade: Green or Black 8th grade: Gold or Black

No Hoodies: Hooded sweatshirts are not allowed in the building

#### **Bottoms**

Pants: Khaki, Navy, or Black or Jeans: Any color (no holes or rips)

Shorts and Skirts: any color and must reach at least mid-thigh (no holes or rips)

# CLASSROOMCOMMUNITIES


