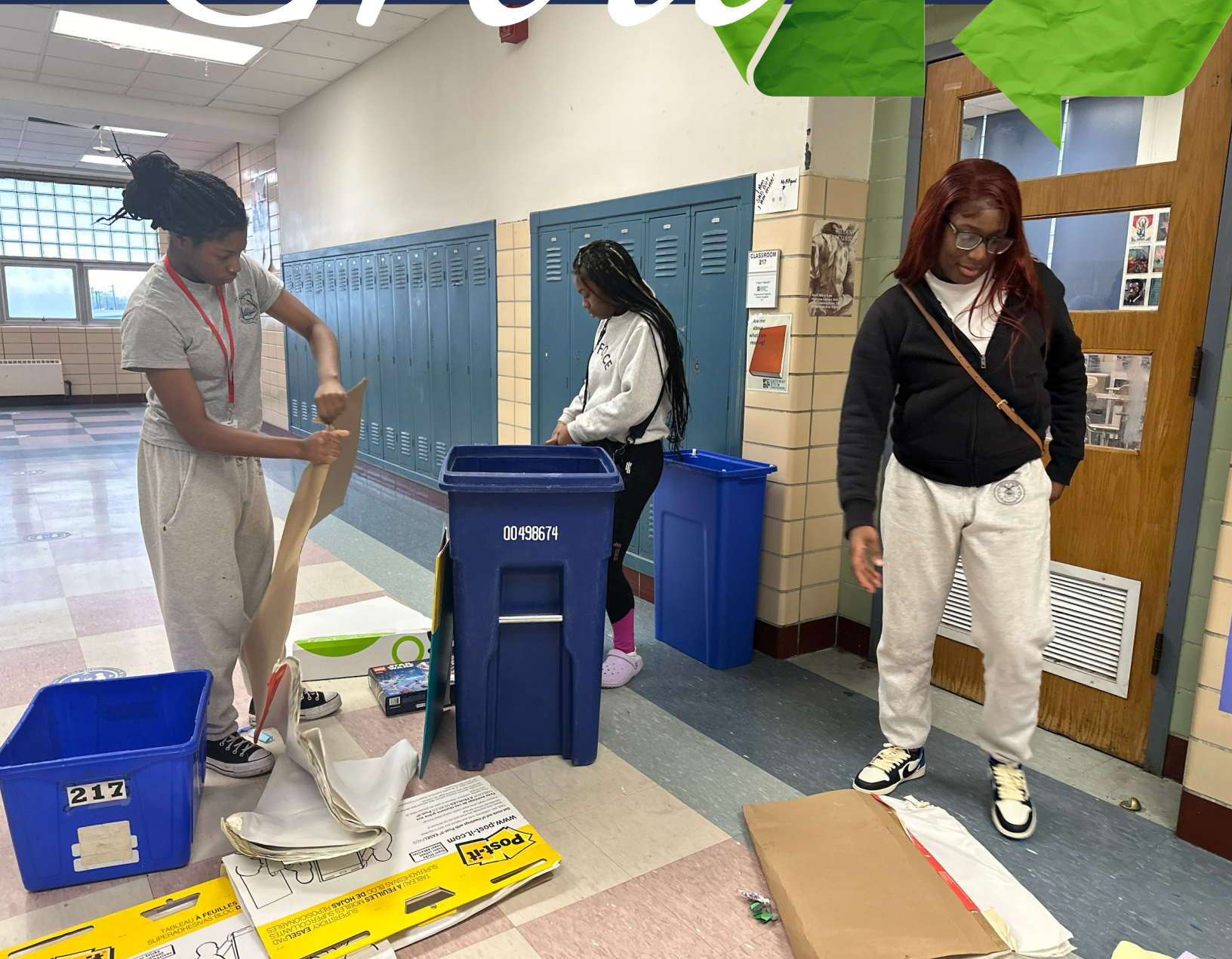

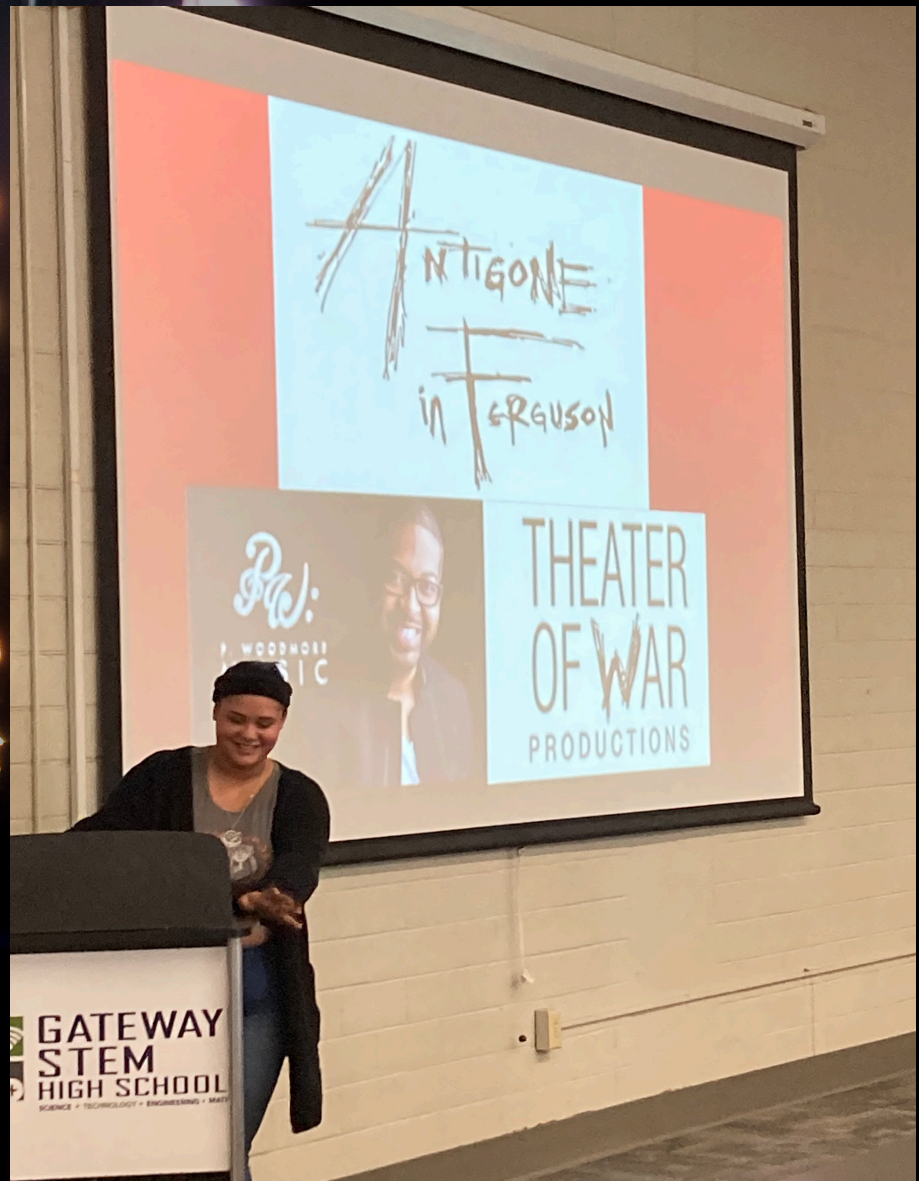

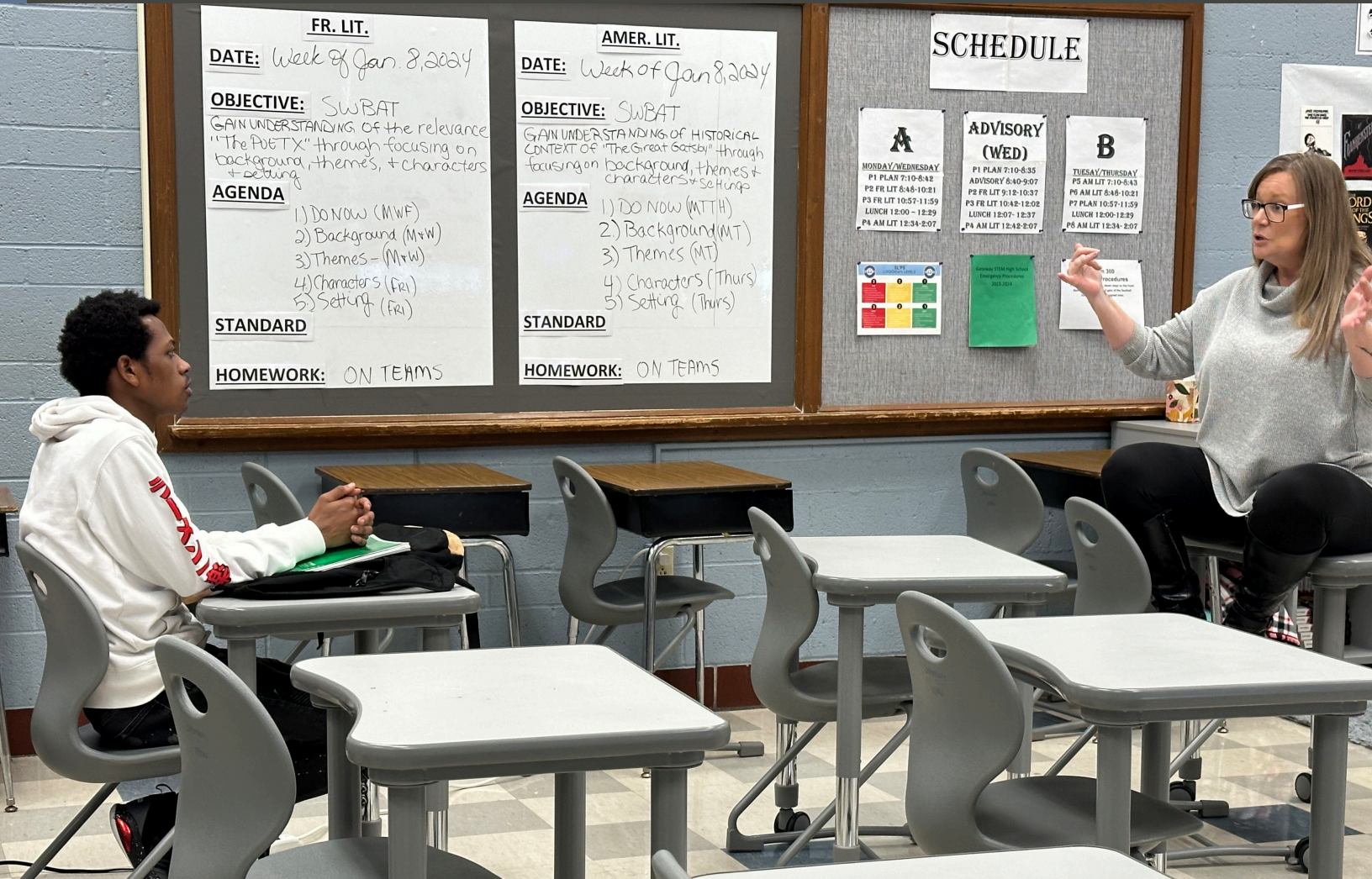

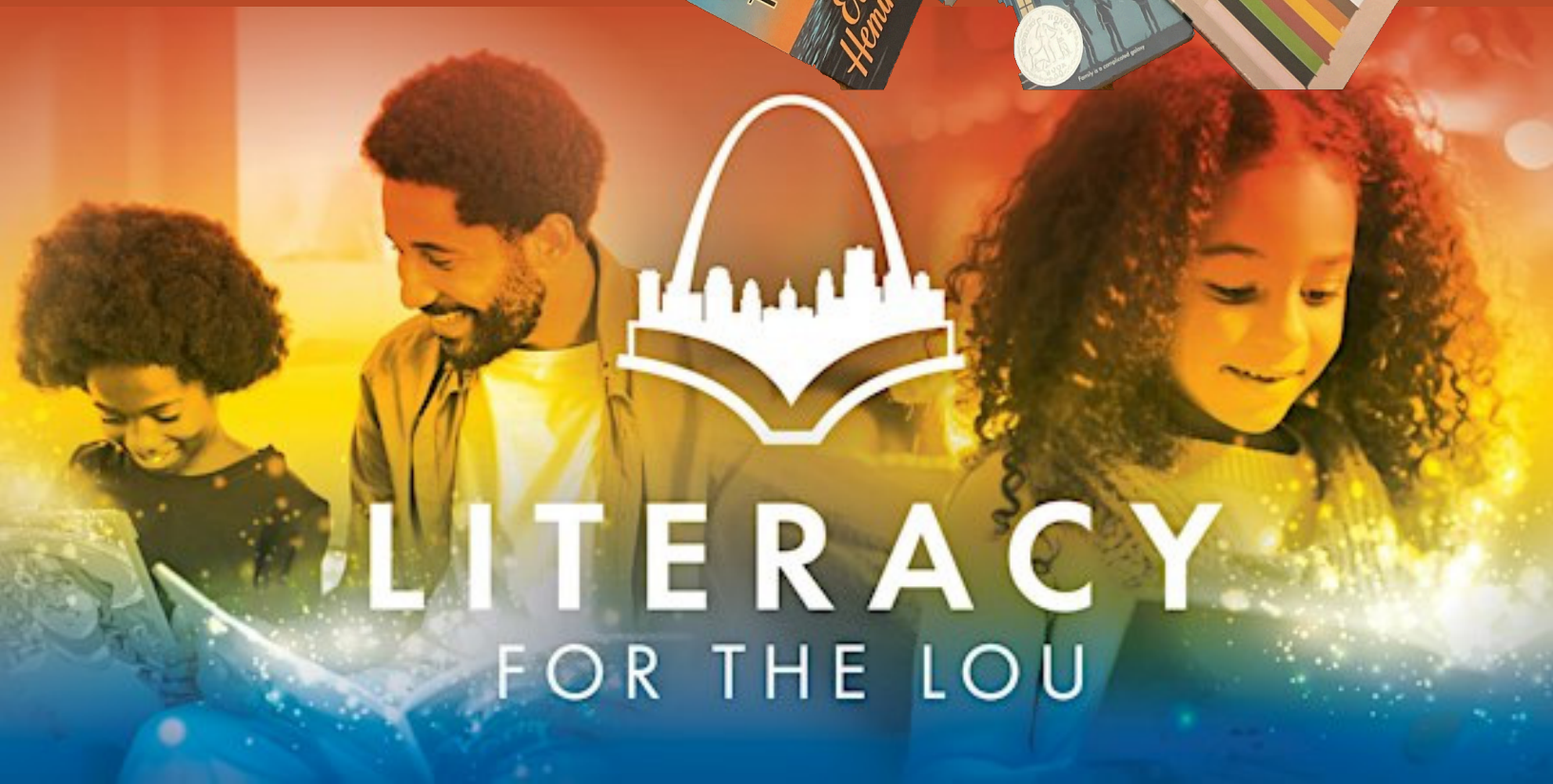
# Empower Minds, Ignite Imaginations: Unleash the Power of Literacy for a Brighter Future!

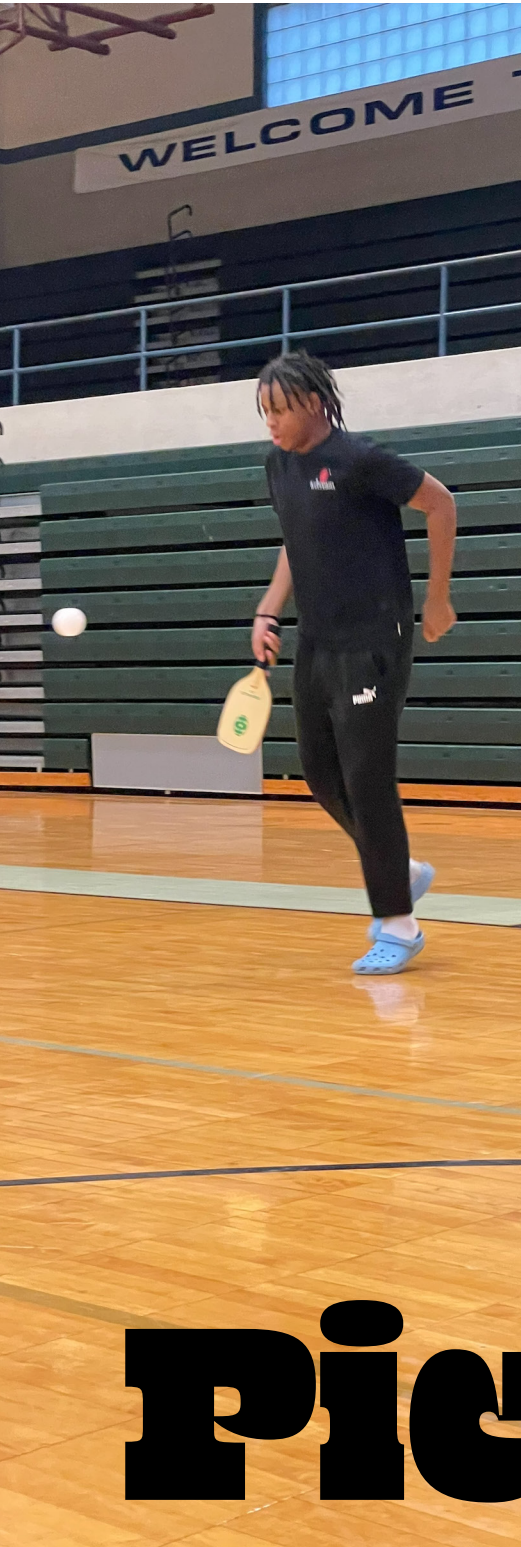

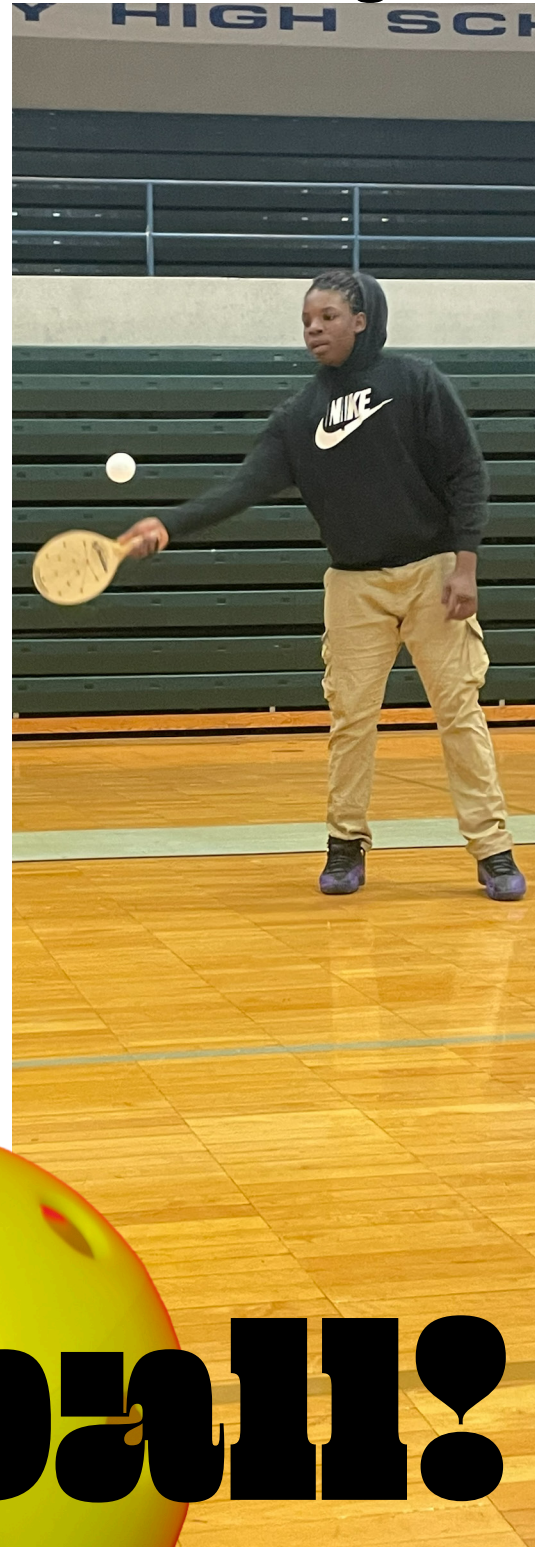

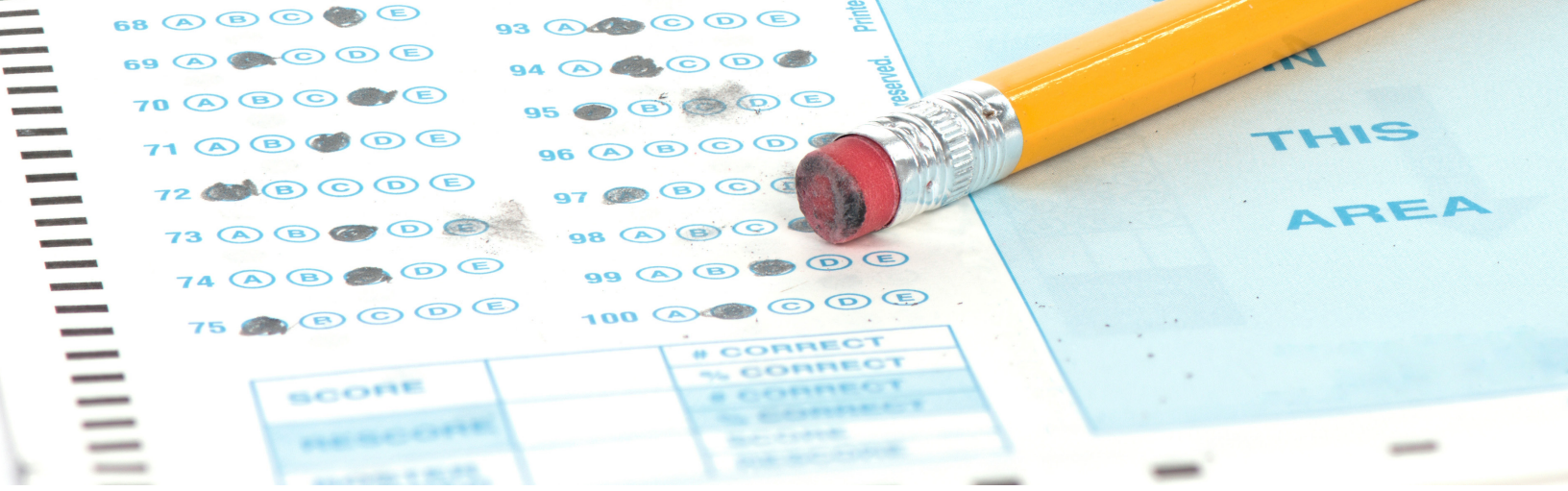
