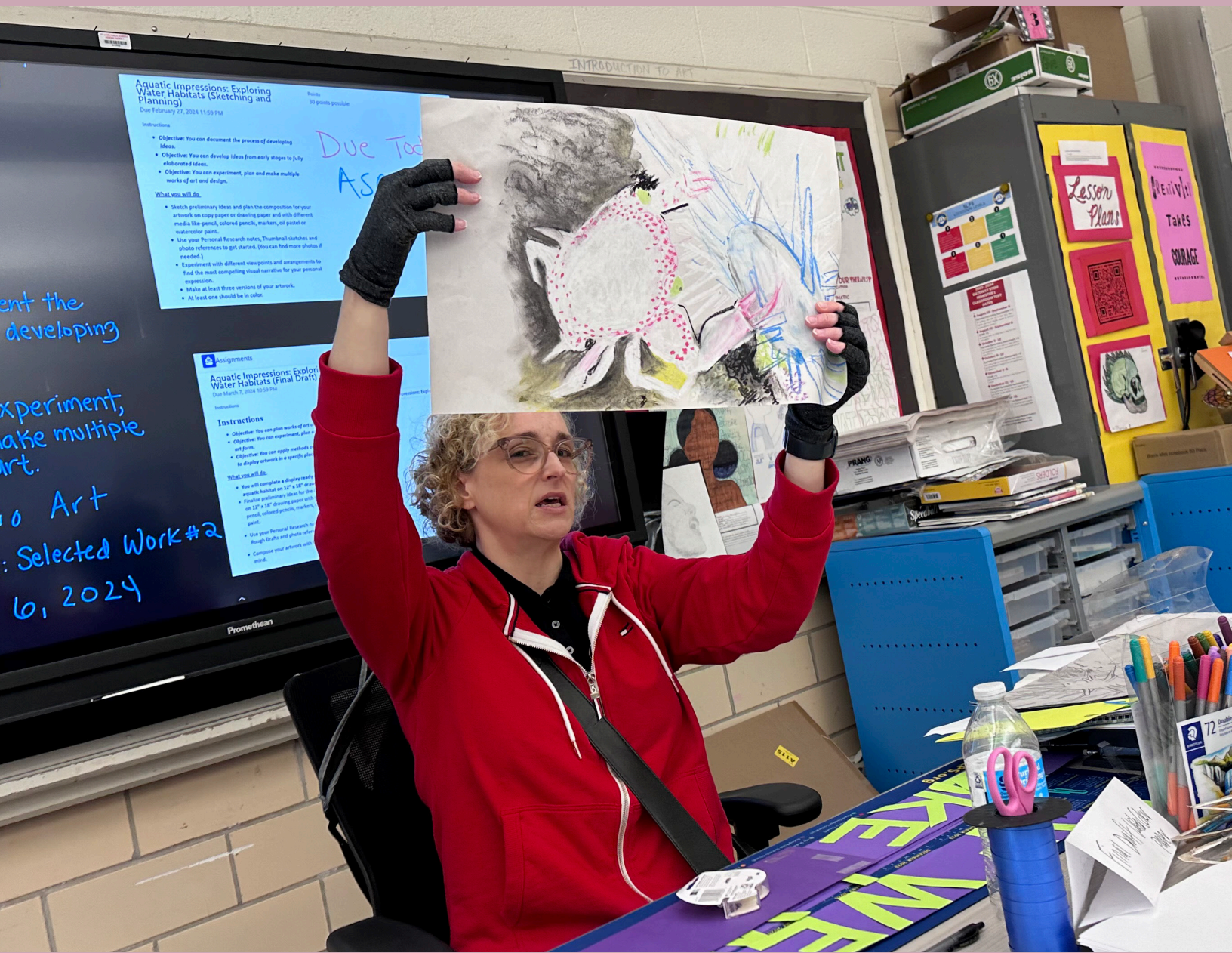



It is one of the animals that inhabits the Missouri River and is related to waterfowl and geese.




Majestic Pelican

This majestic bird has a distinctive large pouch that hangs from the lower half of its long straight bill.




Climate and Environment in Missouri River

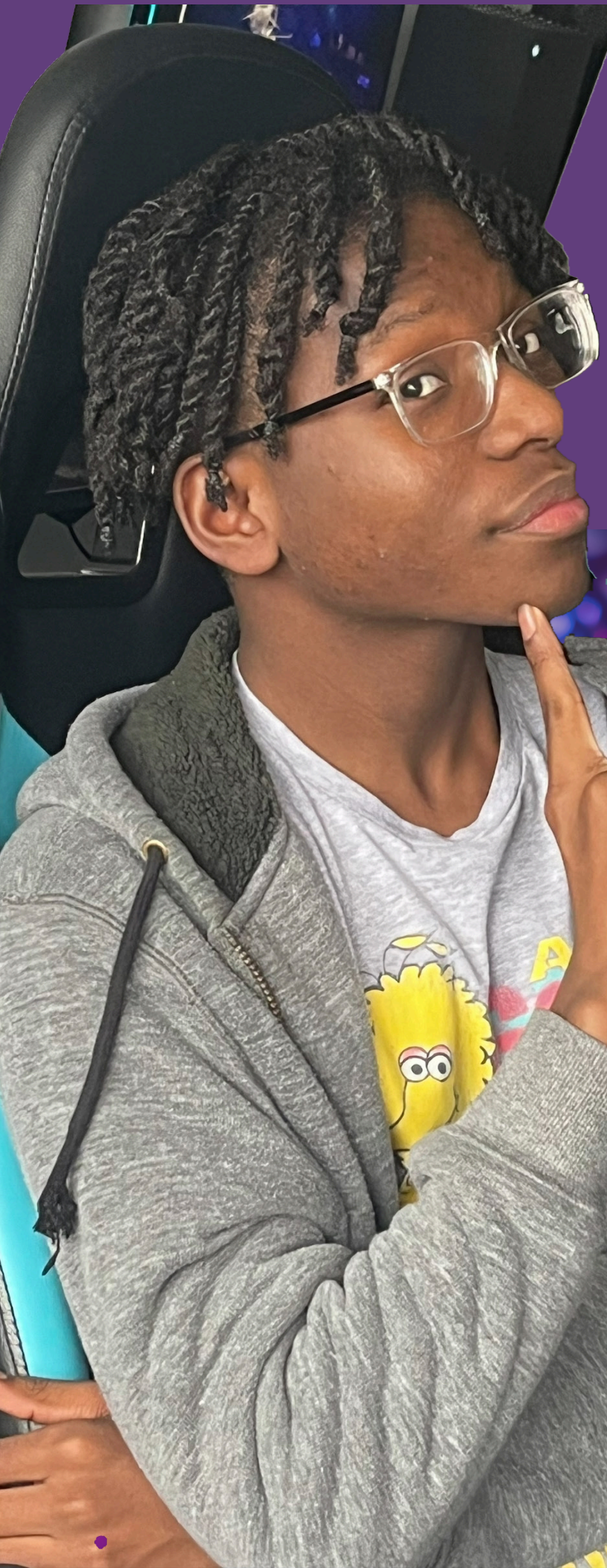

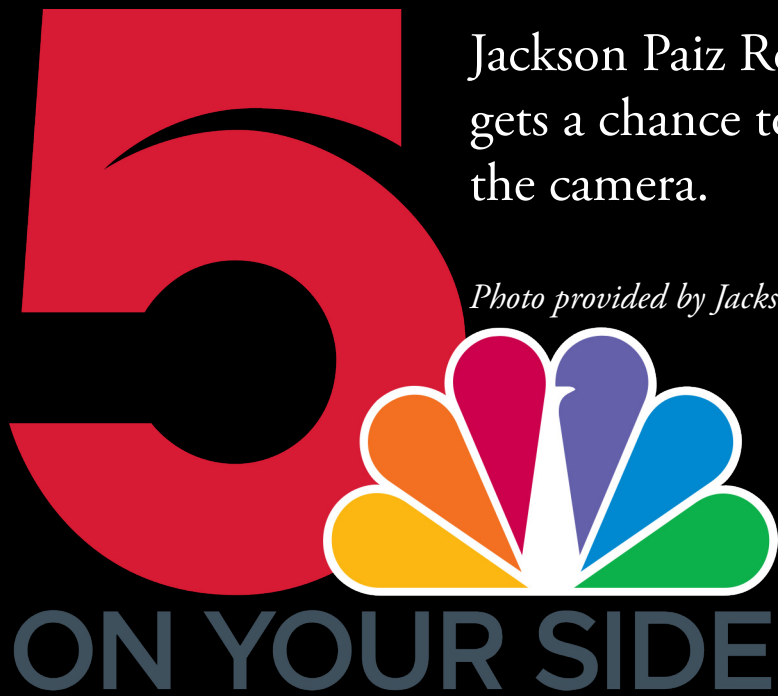

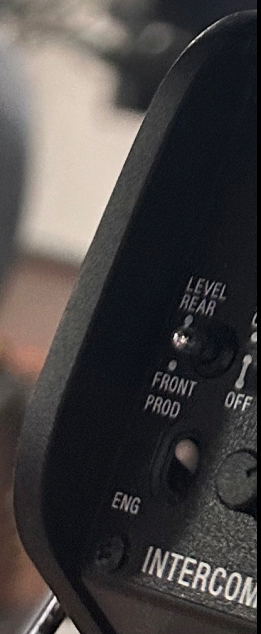

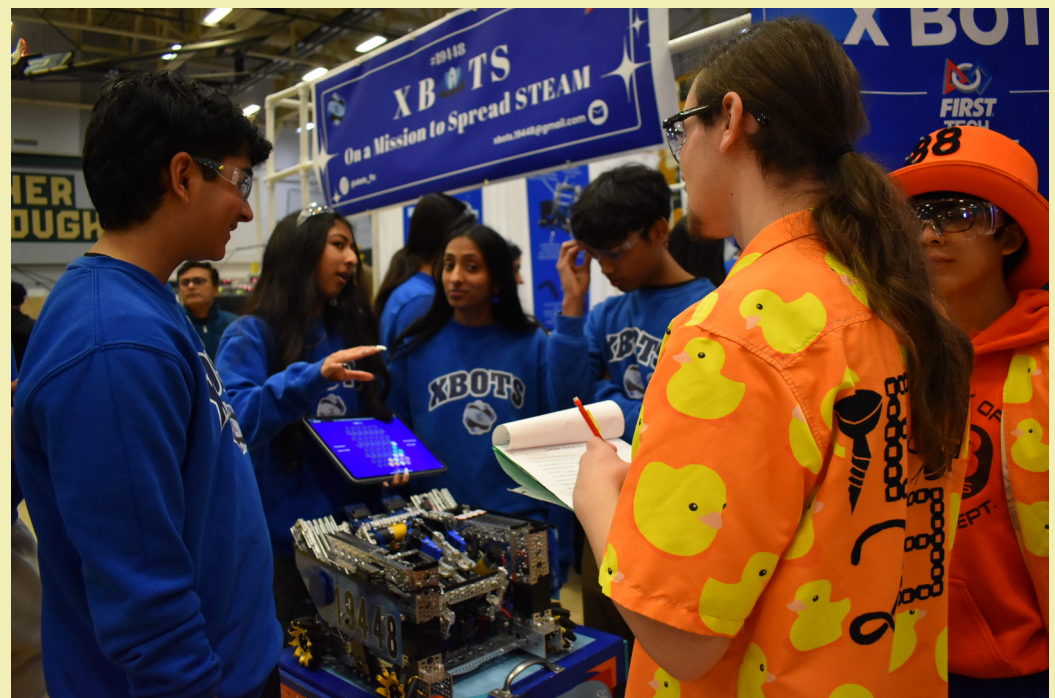

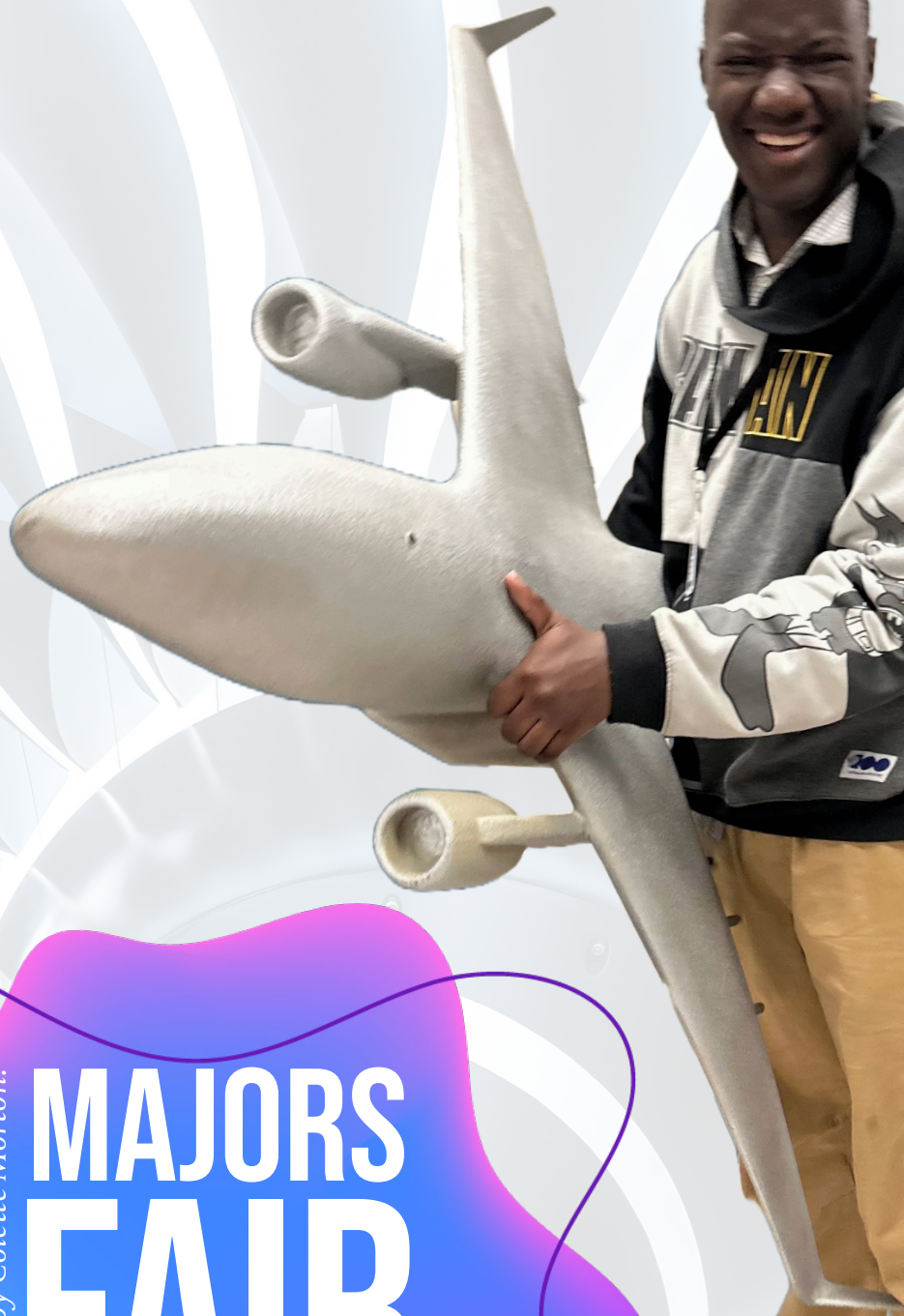
