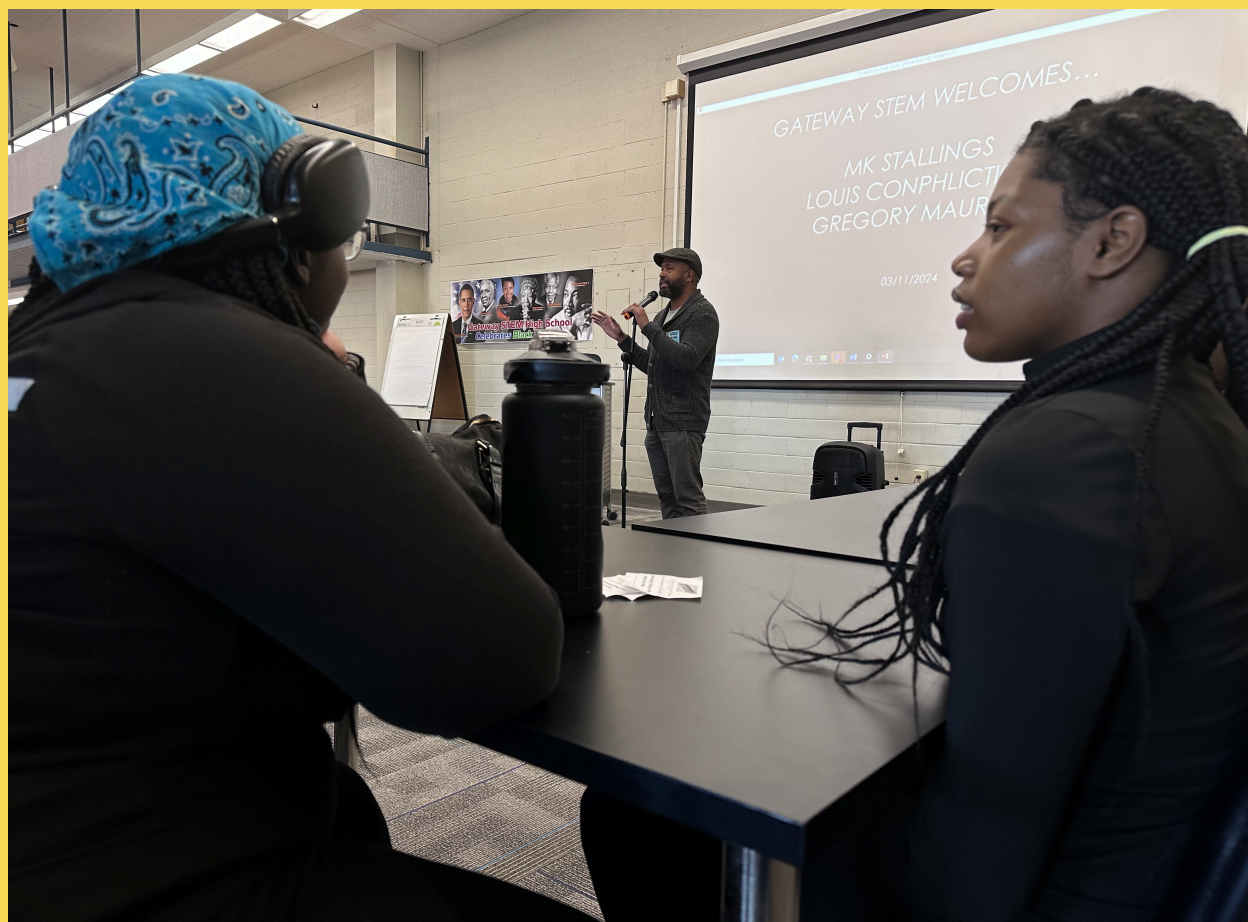

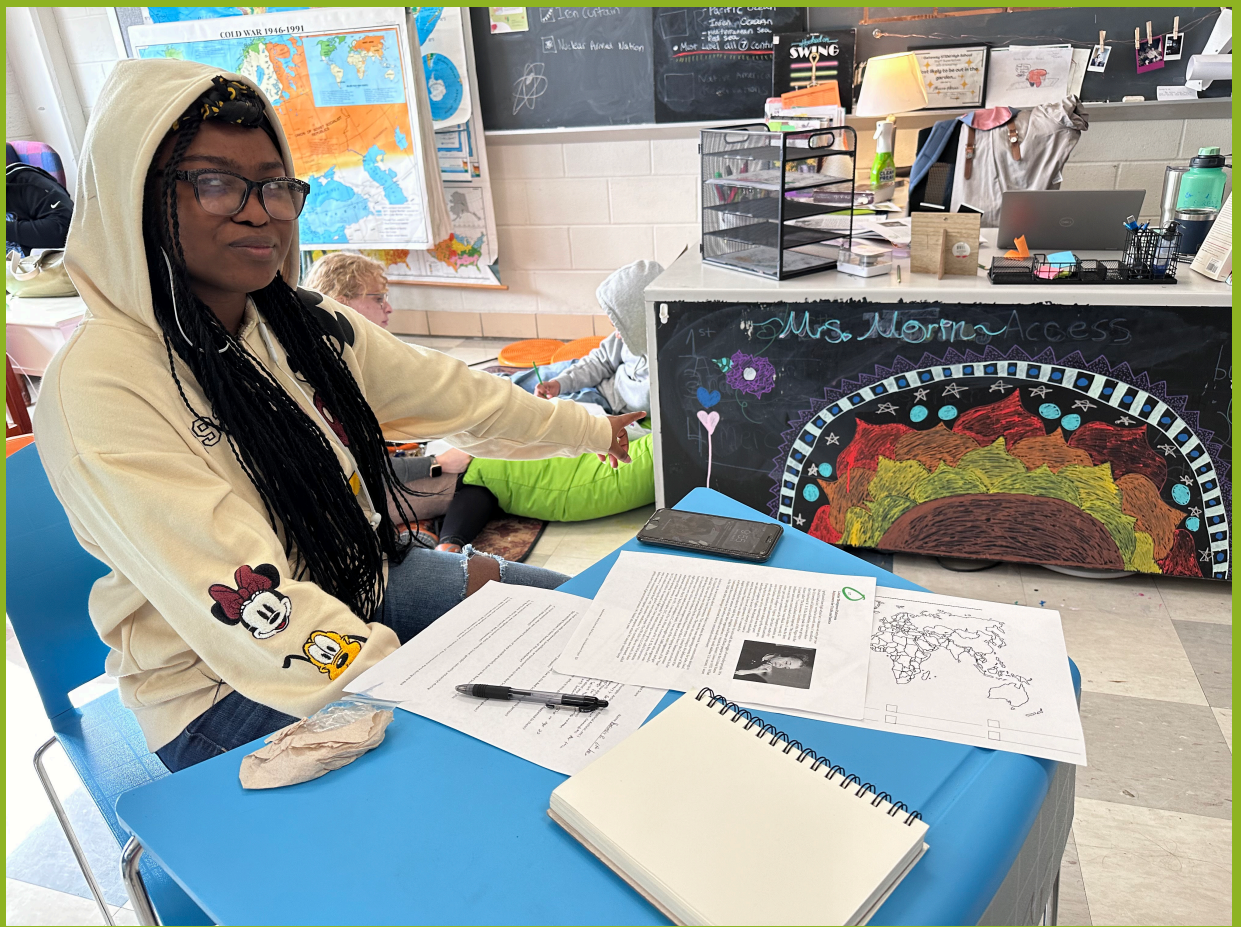

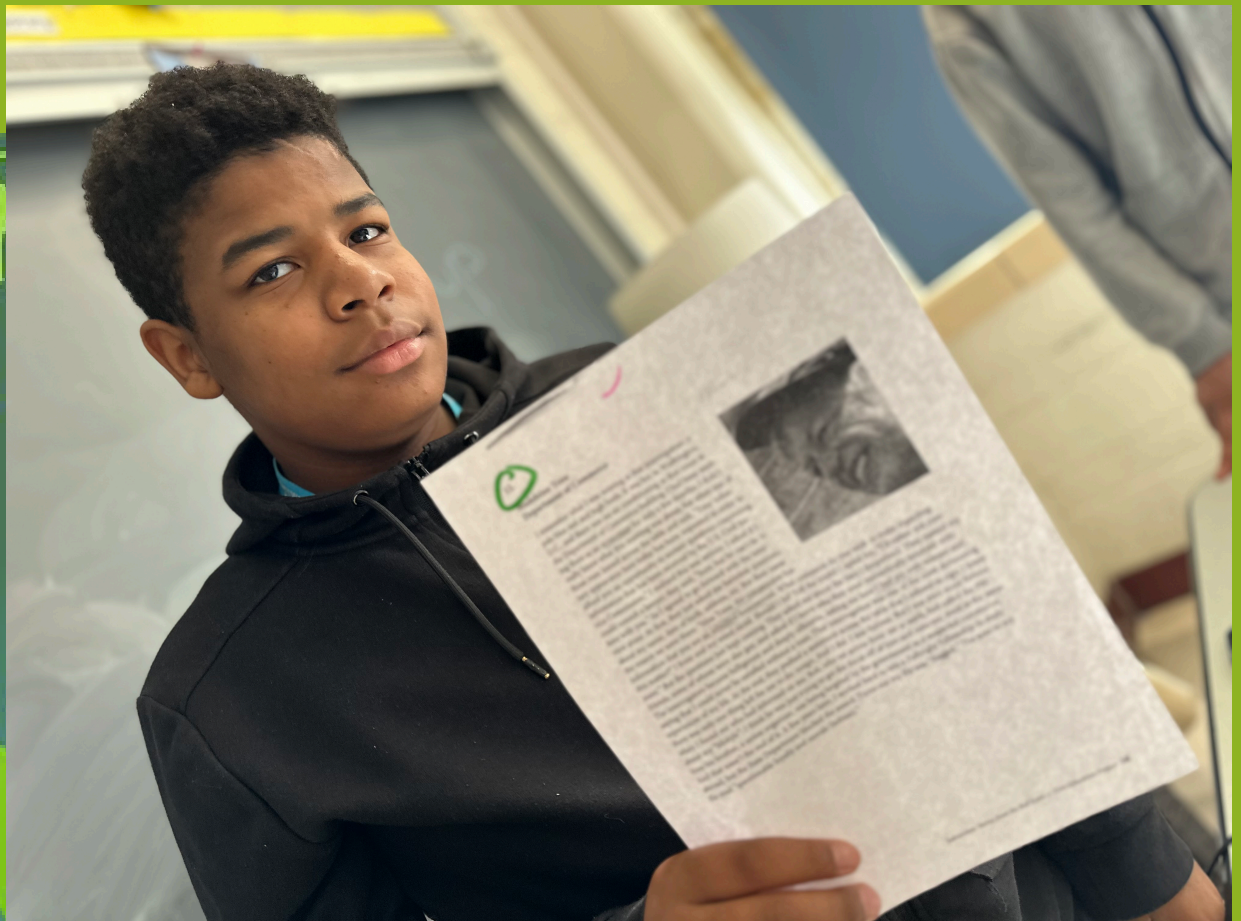

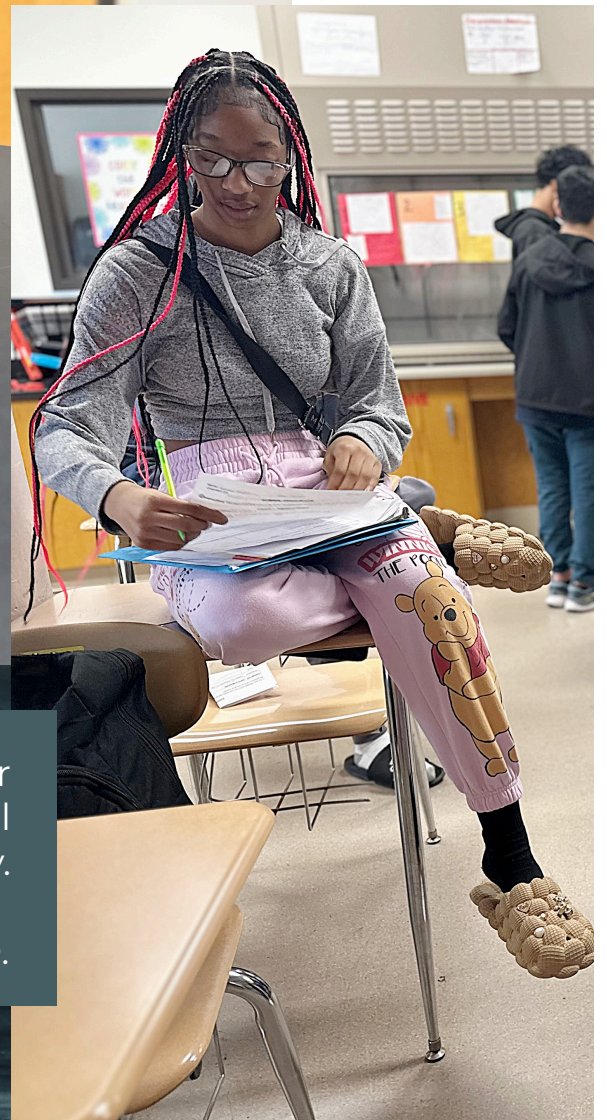

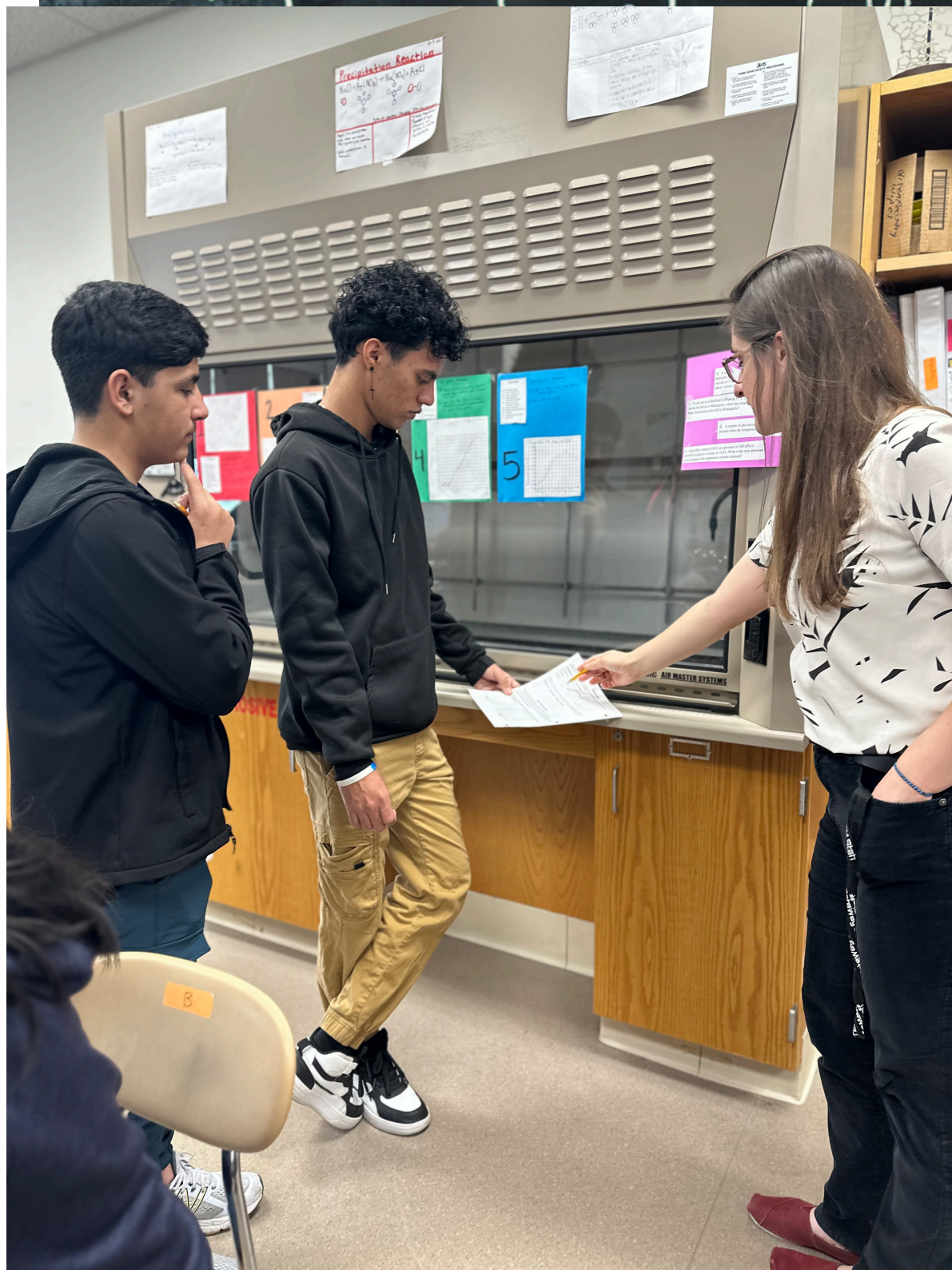

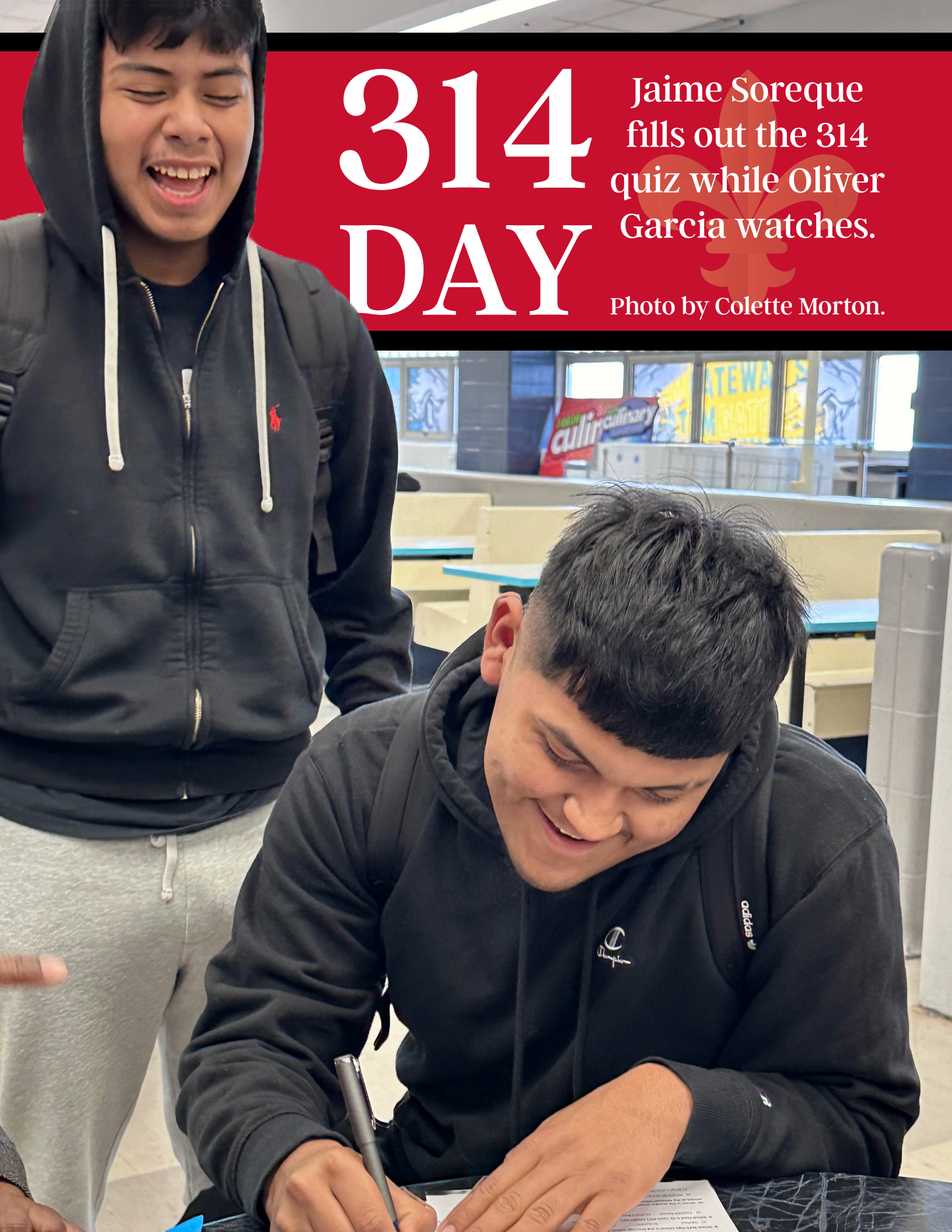

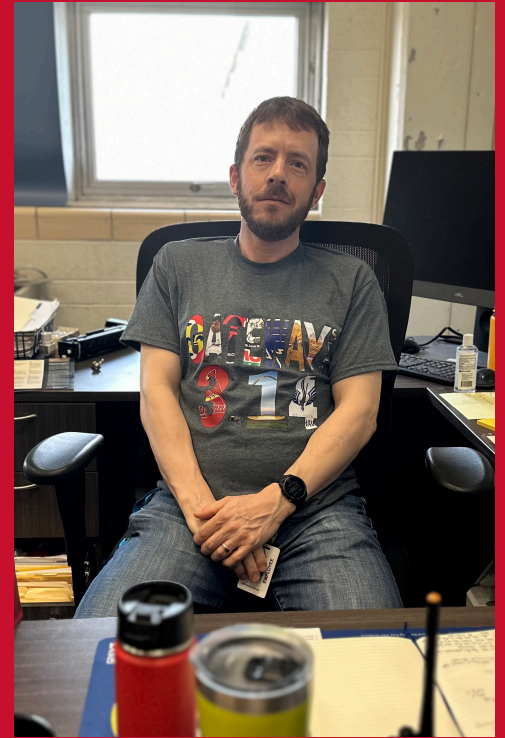
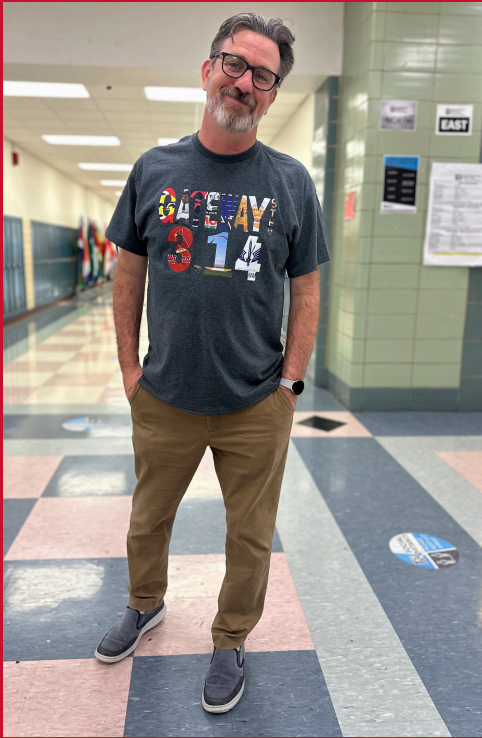

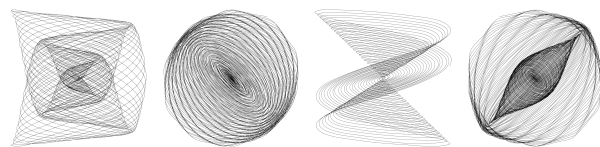

For the last twenty-four years, I have walked 2E to my room. I have seen literally thousands of students standing by these windows, enjoying the breeze or taking

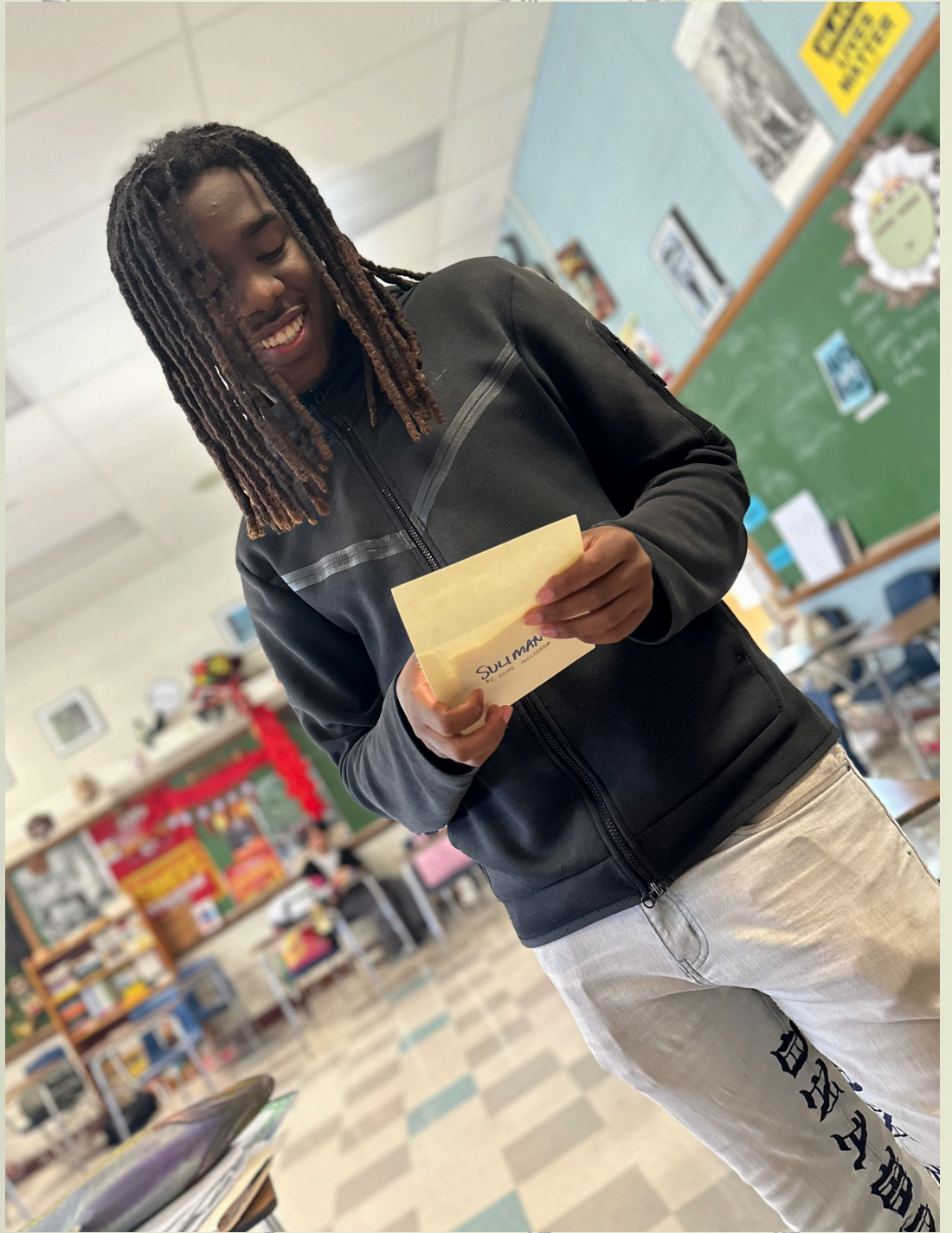
photos of the sunrise. Sometimes they are making TikToks, and sometimes they are laughing or sharing with friends. It is a magical place.
