Introducing Sown to Grow

St. Louis Public Schools is rolling out weekly student social emotional learning (SEL) check-ins and reflections via Sown to Grown. The check-ins are short, requiring just a few minutes to complete, but give valuable information about students' social emotional well-being. Students at Collegiate complete their check-ins and reflections on Tuesdays at the beginning of the Mentor Period. Mentors then have immediate access to students' comments in the Sown to Grow platform and are able to provide timely feedback. School counselors Ms. Boskamp and Ms. Cluts also monitor students' reflections and are available to meet with students who may need additional support.


